Capital Expenditure and Buyer Potential

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LABELEXPO EUROPE 2025 ATTRACTS RECORD NUMBER OF VISITORS



Newly rebranded **LOUPE** (full meaning – Labels & Outer Packaging Embellishment) **Labelexpo Europe 2025** took place for the first time in the historic **Spanish** city of **Barcelona** at a time when the label converting industry is witnessing rapid consolidation and transformation hence enabling label converters to either diversify into flexible packaging and/ or identify new opportunities in folding cartons to become a 'one-stop' package printing operations that encompass the full range of packaging formats. With more products, more launches, and more live demonstrations at the world's largest event for the label and package printing industry, this **SPECIAL FEATURE ARTICLE**, adapted from the **POSTSHOW REPORT** by the organiser - **Informa Markets**, shows why the 4-DAY event that took place at **Fira Gran Via** from **16 to 19 September** was truly **THE GREATEST SHOW ON EARTH** in many ways aside recording the highest number of international visitors since established 45years ago:

Labelexpo Europe 2025, held for the first time in Barcelona in its 45-year history, has concluded as the biggest show to date, both in exhibition space and attendance, including the highest international participation.

Show statistics revealed it was the largest Labelexpo event to date, with over 43,000 net sqm of exhibitor space. The event also broke attendance records with over 37,000 attendees. Key statistics include an increase of 18 percent in top decision makers, 49 percent in South American visitors, and 28 percent in North American visitors. And while Spain dominated the list of top visiting countries alongside Italy, Germany, France, and the United Kingdom, thereby confirming the move to Barcelona as a well-thought-out plan.

According to Labelexpo Global Series, Strategic Director - Andy Thomas-Emans; 'The move to Barcelona for Labelexpo Europe 2025 is a strategic milestone in the show's 45-year history. Breaking records in both exhibition space and attendance demonstrates the industry's continued growth and the global appeal of the new location. We are particularly encouraged by the significant increase in international participation, especially from the Americas, which validates our commitment to creating a truly global platform for the labels and package printing industry. We witnessed an industry embracing automation, sustainability, and the beginnings of Al integration. All signals of a vibrant sector that continues to evolve and innovate.'

Technology and Launches

Labelexpo Europe 2025 was a hotbed for innovations in automation and sustainability. For flexo, digital, and hybrid press technologies, the key themes converged around automation, Cloud network integration, and the first developments in Al-driven machine and user interfaces. Several of the digital launches are set to facilitate converters' entry to digital and

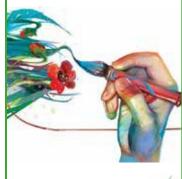

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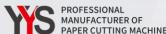














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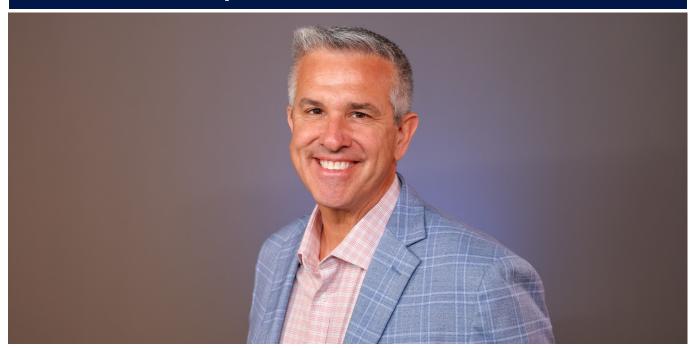

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13 TIPS FROM AN HR EXPERT



Spring is a magical time for human resource professionals. It is a respite from holiday scheduling that is now in the rearview mirror. The end-of-year crush of open enrollment, performance evaluations, bonuses, and compensation adjustments is finishing up. We are also just ahead of the manpower issues that scheduling around summer vacations can create. Soon, the end-of-school recruitment season will be upon us, providing a larger pool of candidates to apply for job postings, which naturally makes HR processes and procedures cumbersome at this time of the year. This COVER STORY is adapted from a **Printing Impressions** article written by **Adriane Harrison**, Vice President of Human Relations Consulting at **PRINTING United Alliance**, to help HR practitioners in the industry navigate HR processes and procedures smoothly.

And because this is the only semblance of "downtime" in a busy HR calendar, it is a good time to consider ways to work on HR processes and procedures. Here are some tips to consider:

1| Build in some fun, and celebrate your employees and your company.

Many people are feeling unsettled by national and international events. Elevate your company culture by providing some stress relief. Throw a party with entertainment, such as hiring an illusionist. Bring in food trucks occasionally and treat the team to lunch, or if that is too pricey, an ice cream truck for a mid-shift treat. Also, consider tricking

out the break room with a pinball machine, arcade game, table tennis, or foosball. Fresh off the excitement of the most recent March Madness, consider running a bracket contest, which boosts employee engagement and provides a fun way for team members to interact. Have the company provide the prizes to the winners. Although nobody is going to match Warren Buffett's \$1 million prize for the NCAA bracket winner within the Berkshire Hathaway family of businesses, a \$100 gift card or cash would build excitement and bring people together for the tournament. Other similar activities might be to have a fantasy league for football or baseball, with a similar prize-winning opportunity.

2 | Take a hard look at your culture and ask whether it is a place that Gen Z — the bulk of your workforce candidates for the next decade or more — would like to be.

If it is not, start shifting your culture now so you

aren't fighting hard for employees later. For some insight on attracting Gen Z candidates, check out Toni McQuilken's article in the box on page 32.

3 | Review your company's digital presence — both website and social media — and spend time comparing it to others that you see (and like).

While HR people are not marketing people, we can recognize images and words that will attract prospective employees. Look at your website carefully. Do you have a "careers" page? Does it reflect the company's culture? Is it easy to find and apply for open positions? Can

information about your company and its culture in images and short videos. Evaluate what platforms the company is on and whether those tools are reaching the intended audience. If the company isn't using social media, consider getting active on LinkedIn, Instagram, TikTok, and Facebook. Videos, more than any other media, will grab the attention of your future workforce. And Gen Z is on TikTok, which is purely video

5 | In light of the focus on immigration issues in the new administration, get ready for a government audit, just in case.

To prepare, review all of the I-9 forms (as in the case of the USA) to make sure the correct information is on them, in the correct places on the form. For employment and immigration issues in the US, start with the official websites, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS). And for other countries, check with the relevant government agencies and immigration authorities to ensure your company complies with updated rules and regulations on staffing and staff issues.

6 | Before the pressure is on in the months preceding open enrollment, look at the benefits the company offers and consider changing them a bit.

You may want to informally survey a few employees discreetly to see if they have suggestions about changing the benefits. Avoid taking an actual survey, because the "asks" may be beyond what the company can provide, and morale may be affected if the suggestions provided are not offered as benefits in the next round of benefits.

7 | Train your supervisors and managers in the soft skills required of leadership positions.

Communication is the key to creating a positive relationship between employees and management. The adage that "people don't quit a job, they quit a manager" still holds true. Teach your managers to recognize when someone on their team is struggling. Help them learn to connect with the employees so that when there are challenges, a foundation for healthy communication has already been established. Money spent helping managers communicate effectively and be empathetic is an investment that will provide returns in lower turnover and consequently higher productivity and reduced recruitment costs.

8 | Review your company's communication strategy with employees.

Assess how employees are getting information they can trust from leadership. Do you have a newsletter? An occasional town hall meeting? Or is information passed down through managers, which risks a distortion from "playing telephone". Gen Zs are skeptics. For this generation of workers, trust is earned rather than given. Gen Z has handled an enormous number of challenges in their relatively young lives. The need for management to build trust is a result, in part, of Gen Z having experienced stressors that have become a way of life. Things like performing active shooter drills throughout childhood and being the first generation of digital natives who have navigated online lives of scrutiny, judgment, and rampant deception. Clear and direct communication between the leadership team and the employees will be important to creating trust, positive morale, and retaining employees.

9 | Ramp up the rewards.

Employees like recognition, so acknowledging great work, milestones, or "over-and-above" effort by employees demonstrates how important a good employee is to the company. Doing so publicly shows the whole team that management cares and may also motivate them to strive to achieve similar recognition. The rewards can be small or large, depending on the company's budget and the type of recognition. For instance, volunteering to pitch in to help a teammate might be worthy of a gift card. Eclipsing a decade or more at the company might be worthy of a bonus and additional paid time off.

10 | Evaluate the company's organizational chart.

Ask a lot of questions when analyzing the org chart. Is it accurate? Does it make sense? Have titles been given equitably? Are salaries and wages compressed? If not, start adjusting the chart to the actualities of the business. Change titles when it makes sense, being conscious of the effect that a title change may mean to others in the company. Ensure managers

are not overloaded with too many direct reports. And when you are all done with the revisions, make sure any changes to the organizational chart should be reflected in the job descriptions for the positions

11 | Create career development plans for your employees.

Poor career development is the No. 1 reason Gen Z will leave a job. A guide on how to start a career development programme will be examined in future articles.

12 | Using that newly revised organizational chart, begin succession

Creating a succession plan serves multiple purposes. First, it puts the company in a good position to respond to the sudden departure or loss of key personnel without total disruption of the business. Second, it is a vehicle for growth because going through the process of succession planning often requires creating some type of strategic plan for the company's future. Third, succession planning results in career development for at least some of the employees.

13 | Audit your company's safety policies and procedures.

If there are jobs people are avoiding, investigate why that is happening. Do people feel uncomfortable or unsafe performing those duties? Are employees fully trained in safety procedures that would provide the confidence to do these tasks? If not, arrange for training and then reinforce the training with additional attention from supervisors and managers.

This long list will more than fill the "spare" time for an HR professional, so pick a few items on this list and see if they can be achieved this year. Then make a plan for next year, and maybe the year past that. The result that will come out is a strategic plan for human resources development, which will benefit your company for many years in the future.

WHAT DOES GEN Z REALLY WANT IN A WORKPLACE?

For Print Service Providers (PSPs) looking to hire and retain talent, consulting content from a wide range of experts is beneficial. However, to appeal to the next generation of workers, it's important to understand what their priorities are, what type of work environment they value, and what challenges might arise during the search for new talent. Xiaoying Rong, Professor, Graphic Communication Department at the College of Liberal Arts, Cal Poly in California, posed these very questions to her students.

She summed up their responses, noting, "The top things that students mentioned when entering the workforce are financial stability and sustainable salary. The location of the job, supportive culture, respect for diversity, and willingness to learn from the younger generation at the workplace are also at the top of the list. The possibility of remote work can be attractive, too."

That mentality was echoed by both Megan Mikami, Account Manager, and Emilia Thein, an experiential Designer, who were both just hired full-time at Image Options in Foothill Ranch, California, after spending a year in the company's robust internship/apprenticeship programme. "Going into the work world

— at least for me as a designer in this space — I feel like my surroundings and the community and space I'm working in are constantly inspiring me," Thein notes. "I can either be locked into my computer and work ... or I can be in a complete rut. So, coming from a creative background, I thrive on routine and deadlines, and having an organized system and way of doing things, which is why I think I went down the design route and not the art route."

Mikami has a slightly different take, noting, "I played softball in college — I've been on a team my entire life. And [I wondered] how do I cut that out cold turkey and transition into my new career and find that in a workplace? That was always something I kept in the back of my head when I was interviewing at other places ... what is going to be the environment that I'm entering into?" Mikami continues, "I was looking for a place that would take me for me as someone who doesn't necessarily know exactly what I want to do, but I'm willing to learn and I'm willing to go through it and experience it."

Creating a space where younger generations feel welcomed and free to explore their interests and cultivate their talents tops the list of what many of these workers are seeking. They are also looking for places that offer education and mentorship opportunities — whereas in the past, new hires were expected to come in, be dropped into a situation with minimal training, and were told to figure it out; tomorrow's workers are looking for a far more handson approach. Jules Van Sant, Vice Chair of the Print and Graphics Scholarship Foundation (PGSF), as well as a member of the Graphic Communications Workforce Coalition, observed this when working with and talking to younger workers. "I think strong communication skills are super key," Van Sant says. "I think employers have been very fortunate when they've held on to employees for a long time. It's the unspoken word — we all kind of know how it goes. And the people come in and they're like, 'Well, tell me what I need to do.' And [employers respond with], well, you're going to this corner. That's not how people learn.

"So employers need to become better communicators," she continues. "They need to foster community. They need to foster that culture within their company, and do that kind of mentoring as well as cross-training, so people feel as though they're always being challenged and educated. That's better for the employer, too, because you have people who can step in and back up. But I do think communication — whether it's onverbal with signage, whether it's interactive video, whether it's having company events, whether it's having team meetings — I think that we have to nurture relationships. It's not, 'Oh, you're lucky to have a job.' That's not the world we live in."

Rong points out that while the printing industry has been modernized when it comes to its equipment, the way in which it speaks to and attracts the younger generations has not. "Well-educated students from various programmes – including Cal Poly – are looking for companies with supportive cultures and values that align with their own," Rong says. "They are also looking for jobs that could challenge them."

Capturing Gen Z's Attention

Creating a welcoming culture that values education, mentoring, and training will help keep Gen Z there, but it still leaves the question of how to get them through the doors to begin with. Some of that comes down to a matter of perspective.

"The job market is currently quite competitive, especially in positions related to design and high-tech," Rong says. "When students are searching for positions in print-related fields, there are more marketing, account management, and sales positions. Some students may not be interested in those areas and may find it a bit challenging to find what their technical interests could align with. Many students are interested in project management positions; many printing companies or PSPs may use different titles, making it harder for them to connect with

Another point the Cal Poly students note is the **use of Al in hiring and recruitment.** They consider it just as critical for a potential employer to have well-crafted applications and job documentation as it is for them to have a well-crafted resume and cover letter. On the topic of AI - while the use of these tools to screen applicants has gained steam in the past year, PSPs should still take them with a grain of salt - and be ready to hand-scan documents AI might have rejected. Those tools aren't perfect, and companies might lose out on excellent candidates without anyone in the company ever seeing their resume.

Does the



process ask the applicant for a resume and then use an online HR/AI tool that asks them to input the same information into a form so they can more easily be bulk analyzed? If so, talented applicants might walk away out of growing frustration.

Van Sant notes that in reality, "a lot of those job boards and recruiters, all their numbers are way down this past year. So I do think you're kind of getting back to that networking." She points out that the old-fashioned approach of connecting with guidance counselors, offering internship programmes, and hosting job fairs on-site so potential future talent can come see what the printing industry really is firsthand, is proving to be a far better tool for finding the best talent in a community, rather than relying on Al tools and job boards.

Mikami says another thing to keep in mind is to be clear about what the job entails. One red flag for her when she was job hunting was a lack of "transparency when it came to applying and knowing exactly what you were going to get into. I think that was difficult to navigate, especially in the job market when there are thousands of people applying to an opening on LinkedIn and you don't really understand exactly what it is," she says. "And it's an entry-level job, but at the same time, it requires you to have five years of experience. How could I have gotten that? I feel like that was a big thing that probably turned me away from some jobs."

When referring to her interview process at Image Options, Emilia Thein points out that being up front can make all the difference. "During a time of applying right out of college, you're going to apply to jobs, and you're in that space where you're going to take what you can get," she notes. "But I felt like my interview experience with Image Options was very genuine and very much (seemed) like they wanted us, and were finding out what we bring to

She continues, "And right out of college, you're applying for all these jobs, you're getting all these rejections of people not even looking at your application. ... It just feels like even though this may be a corporate setting, there's such a personable and genuine feel to the company that stands out a lot. A lot of things are moving online, and people are turning their cameras off, and human interaction isn't as prevalent as it once was. I really like that this company prioritizes [connections]."

Perhaps the biggest takeaway isn't that Gen Z is looking for the latest and greatest technology or for a place where they can live on their phones and be plugged in 24/7. Instead, many of them are desperately seeking human connections and want to find that in their place of work. They want to find somewhere they can learn and grow, where they can be part of something bigger than themselves, and feel like what they do matters. They want to speak with real people, not just screens. Maybe what the industry needs to do to hire and retain tomorrow's talent isn't going more high-tech, but rather, it needs to get back to the basics.

Enormous cost and competitive pressure, as well as the increasing difficulty of recruiting suitable personnel on the market, are driving the printing industry. An additional challenge is the fact that printing companies now have to generate a significant portion of their revenue, which they previously achieved with high-volume orders, through a large number of small orders. With conventional working methods, it is difficult to manage such an order structure economically. The solution is the consistent digitization and automation of as many processes as possible, as well as the increased use of robotics to reduce manual intervention to an absolute minimum.

These topics were addressed at **SHIFT 2025**, a new two-day event format organized by **Heidelberger Druckmaschinen AG** (HEIDELBERG) featuring external speakers on the one hand and interactive practical workshops on the other. More than **200 guests** from all over Europe and overseas attended the summit.

Practical examples provide solutions

The first day focused on practical applications from various companies. One of the six speakers was **Rob Cross**, co-Managing Director of **Micropress Printers LTD** (from Reydon, England). He described how the company has accelerated its processes and alleviated the shortage of personnel thanks to automation, robotics, and Al. Micropress produces on a Speedmaster XL 106 with Plate to Unit and on several digital printing systems. All processes are controlled via Prinect. At the folding machines, robots, including a StackStar P from HEIDELBERG, place the packages on pallets. Autonomous Mobile Robots (AMR) move the pallets between the individual machines.

Bauer Packaging Germany specializes in label printing and packaging production. The company has largely digitized its production. Using a combination of Prinect Production from HEIDELBERG and Symphony from Ctrl-s, the numerous label orders are bundled, the impositions are automatically laid out, and the output is sent to several digital printing systems. Compucut Auto-Control calculates the cutting programs fully automatically on Polar cutting technology. Around 700 orders are processed every day. Orders received by 7 p.m. are delivered on the same day from 9 p.m. For the more than 600 million folding cartons produced annually, Bauer Packaging works with a new high-performance Mastermatrix 106 CSB die cutter, among other equipment.

Prinect Touch Free unlocks potential in digitalization

In the printing industry, the range of tasks that need to be digitized and automated is particularly wide. It extends from order entry, planning, production, and materials management to shipping, invoicing, and the evaluation of KPIs (key performance indicators). The second day of the event at the Home of Print in Wiesloch-Walldorf was dedicated to this broad topic. HEIDELBERG, together with its partners,

Elsewhere, POSITIVE+ invested in a new Impala 5 from swissQprint, while Plockmatic Group, which counts Morgana, Intec, and Renz among its brands,

reported high levels of sales at the show.
